**Obiettivi:**

How does our food reach our plates and mouths? Who does the work, here and globally? How does migration intersect with citizenship and other institutionalized fault lines (boundaries) of social inequality to organize who produces food, where, under what conditions? How do racialization, legal status, gender, age, etc. intersect in the organization of what we eat, and how it reaches our plates? (and what financial and other infrastructure supports these processes)

States play a key role in “managing” migration. That is, in sorting, ordering, including, excluding, detaining, deporting, and broadly speaking, establishing a regulatory framework and enforcement mechanisms that establish terms and conditions for entry, ongoing presence, access and removal. But states are not the only actors shaping the experiences of migrants or how food reaches us. We also have to consider global mobility regimes, transnational capitals, various levels of government, state and private institutions, faith-based institutions, private service providers, brokers, and civil society, including migrant organizations. And more. This course will use food as a point of entry into the complex set of social actors and institutions implicated in producing food, and getting it to you as consumers. We will also consider organizing and other efforts to improve the lives of migrant workers (with precarious status) who are involved in these processes.
